As we discussed today, I believe strongly that a person accused of something has a basic right to fair and equal access to the information , data, documents, and reports that you, the reviewing official , use to make a decision. I consider it a pre-requisite to my review of the allegations, investigation, and the results in order for me to decide whether it has been a fair, equitable and legal process.

On previous occasions, I have been provided the complete data and documents that I am now requesting.

I appreciate your consideration and willingness to do the right thing and am hopeful that this will be resolved satisfactorily.
